### Use of Pupil Premium 2012-2013

#### Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. In 2013 this will also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. From September 2012, we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

#### Our School

In 2012-13 St Alban's Catholic Primary School received £16,198 for Pupil Premium. Other funding was added to this to ensure that we could support **all** of our most disadvantaged pupils. Nineteen pupils were eligible for the Pupil Premium grant.

Activities selected	What this does?
1. Additional Maths support	Small group work to improve basic numeracy.
2. Saturday Morning	Maths targeting level 4, 5 & 6 at the end of KS2
3. Resources for Saturday Mornings	Reprographics costs, refreshments and incentives
4. Professional Assessments	Clarify areas of need
5. Support from Home School Link Worker	The Home School Link Worker has been working with targeted families to improve attendance at school and provide support and advice to parents.
6. Fresh Start, Read,Write Inc Resources	Small group work to improve Reading and Writing levels.
7. Subsidised trips	To support children from low income families access & residential trips.
8. Mathletics & Spellodrome licences	Software to improve numeracy & literacy, can be accessed from home.
9. Guided Reading	Whole staff Inset training
10. Guided Reading Books	Classroom resources

11. Education City	Foundation KS1 Maths on line activity
12. Collins books	Maths books, pupil books and teacher guides
13. Hamilton Trust	Teaching resource to help with planning
14. Test base	Resources
15. Additional Maths teaching to raise standards	Specialist teacher
16. TA Training & cover	Building knowledge and expertise
