### Use of Pupil Premium 2013-2014

#### Background

The Pupil Premium is allocated to children from low-income families who are currently known to be eligible for Free School Meals (FSM) in both mainstream and non-mainstream settings and children who have been looked after continuously for more than six months. In 2014 this will also include pupils eligible for FSM at any point in the last six years (known as the Ever 6 FSM measure).

Schools are free to spend the Pupil Premium as they see fit. However we will be held accountable for how we have used the additional funding to support pupils from low-income families. From September 2012, we are required to publish online information about how we have used the Premium. This will ensure that parents and others are made fully aware of the attainment of pupils covered by the Premium and the extra support that they receive.

#### Our School

In 2013-14 St Alban's Catholic Primary School received £20,700 for Pupil Premium. Other funding was added to this to ensure that we could support **all** of our most disadvantaged pupils. Nineteen pupils were eligible for the Pupil Premium grant.

Activities selected	What this does?
1. Saturday Morning	Maths targeting level 4, 5 & 6 at the end of KS2
2. Resources for Saturday Mornings	Reprographics costs, refreshments and incentives
3. Professional Assessments	Clarify areas of need
4. Support from Home School Link Worker	The Home School Link Worker has been working with targeted families to improve attendance at school and provide support and advice to parents.
5. Subsidised trips	To support children from low income families access & residential trips.
6. Guided Reading Books	Classroom resources
7. Mathletics licences	Software to improve numeracy, can be accessed from home.
8. Hamilton Trust	Teaching resource to help with planning
9. Test base	Resources
10. Espresso	Teaching resources
11. Clicker 6	Software for literacy support
12. Additional teaching	Specialist teacher to raise standards
13. Small group work/TA support	Extending the less able or more able child to achieve their full potential

14. Easi speak	Builds communication confidence
15. TA Training	Building knowledge and expertise
16. Cameras	Enhances learning experience
17. Whole staff inset training	For example, Safeguarding, data analysis, new curriculum & personalised learning
